

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER SOMEONE TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID-19?

- The medical provider who conducted the COVID-19 test will notify the individual of the test result.
- The local public health department will conduct a case investigation and implement isolation to separate ill individuals.
- The identified close contacts of the positive case will be asked to self quarantine, or help limit further spread by staying away from other people in case they develop the illness.
- The local public health department will continue to monitor the individuals and follow CDC guidance to assist with the discontinuation of isolation and quarantine.
- The media and community MAY NOT be notified when each case is released from isolation and/or quarantine.

Individuals who have completed and met the requirements to discontinue isolation do NOT pose a risk of spreading COVID-19.

ISOLATION

Isolation is used to separate sick people from healthy people. People who are in isolation should stay home. In the home, anyone sick should separate themselves from other members of the home.

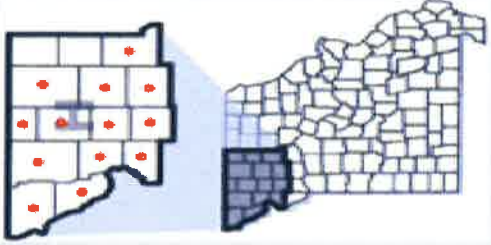
QUARANTINE

Quarantine is used to keep someone who might have been exposed to COVID-19 away from others. Someone in self quarantine stays separated from others, helping limit further spread of COVID-19.
